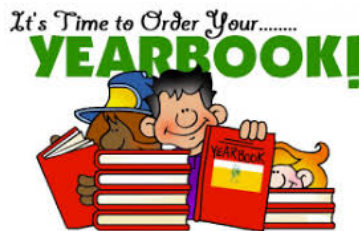

Kids Count, Too!

Kids Count Too! is a specialized group that is designed for families where a parent is diagnosed with cancer. Kids Count Too! (KCT) is a safe place where kids and teens get together and engage in projects and conversations about what it is like to have a family member with cancer.

There are three groups that meet simultaneously, a young child group (ages 7-12 yo) a teen group (13-18 yo) and a parent group. The meetings are held on Wednesdays, 5:30 to 7:30 PM, starting April 25th and running through May 30th. The groups will meet at the Community Senior Center, Route 135 in Natick. **Would you like to increase your child's likelihood of success by
supporting the development of self-determination skills?**

Self-Determination: you may have heard of it, but why is it important to your child's success, and what can you do to support your child's development of these skills? This session with Dr. Lori Peterson will include a **panel of our champion Natick teachers** who will explore these questions and provide evidence-based strategies to increase opportunities to support the development of your child's self-determination skills. You will walk away with tools, techniques, and resources you can use immediately.
