Increasing Your Child's Self-Determination and Positive Outcomes Tuesday, May 22, 7 – 9 pm Natick High School, Lecture Hall -2nd Floor

**Would you like to increase your child's likelihood of success by
supporting the development of self-determination skills?**

Self-Determination: you may have heard of it, but why is it important to your child's success, and what

can you do to support your child's development of these skills? This session with Dr. Lori Peterson will include a **panel of our champion Natick teachers** who will explore these questions and provide evidence-based strategies to increase opportunities to support the development of your child's self-determination skills. You will walk away with tools, techniques, and resources you can use immediately.

Takeaways:

- Describe self-determination and its impact on success.
- Describe strategies aimed to increase your child's self-determination skills and provide opportunities for your child to practice these skills.
- Locate resources available for additional support with promoting self-determination skills.

Dr. Lori Peterson is Assistant Professor of Special Education at the University of Northern Colorado. She is currently working with Natick teachers and staff on developing Self-Determination skills in students.
